## ***Portage Camp 2008***

Camp 2008 dates – Sunday 20 July to Saturday 26 July 2008  
Location – Portage Fair Grounds

Contract negotiations are ongoing. We are looking for alternative method for manure removal so more user friendly for smaller members.

Grounds include enclosed grass ring, enclosed sand ring and grass area at west end of infield; enclosed dressage ring located east of the office building. Enclosing the dressage ring will encourage younger members to participate.

Instructors in place: Cindy Klassen, Lorraine Wilson and Hugh Crawley.  
Suzanna Danyluk will be the Dressage instructor.

Stall check prizes – Budgeted for \$15 per branch to cover cost of purchasing stall check prizes – PPC will do the purchasing.

Instructor breaks & lunches – Budgeted for \$30.00 per branch to cover cost of groceries and drinks. PPC will prepare the snacks and lunches for the instructors.

Incorporating more stable management into Camp 2008, and it will be geared to the D to D2 levels.

Evening activities include:

Monday – Parelli demo with Heather Davey  
Tuesday – currently a free evening (cheap night at the movies)  
Wednesday – Dressage demo with Suzanna Danyluk  
Thursday – Pool Party at Splash Island

Friday – Show Jumping

Hay orders will be included on the registration form with payment to be made at time of registration. Pick up hay on move in day.

Straw – looking at allocating a specified number of bales per stall and may ask each camper to store these bales (3 bales for the week). This is an effort to avoid waste and reduce clean up at the end of camp.

PPC is looking at running a small canteen with penny candy. The Tack Swap will be offered with set hours of operation – likely 10:30 am to about 4:00 each day. The Tack Swap will be closed for lunch hour. More security will be instituted such as a deposit for articles taken out and not paid for in full, or a cheque to cover the cost, sign out book, etc. A craft activity hopefully will be offered at a reasonable fee and PPC is looking at having the campers do the craft in their riding groups.

Camping – must be booked on the registration form with payment made to the Portage Fair Board. Need to specify which group you want to camp with, type of unit, including length and amp service required. If you have a bigger unit, with air and lots of electrical appliances, please camp in the regular campground where your camper's requirements can be fully met. Camping fees give you 7 nights for the price of 6 so you can move your camper in early, or stay a night longer.

Campground rate - \$108

Group camping - \$90

Tenting (no services) - \$60

Pole C issues – this camping area is located directly north of the sand ring. Some issues have arisen in the past however; this area should be filled with Pony Club campers and not left available for outside campers for more control.

*What we need help with:*

Night Checks of the barns. If you have someone who likes to roam around at night,

please let us know as the barns need to be checked during the night.

Camp Photographer – it would be nice to have a picture taken of each riding group

Silent Auction – any volunteers to organize and sell tickets?

Ring upkeep – the grass rings need to be poopy scooped on a regular basis. A branch schedule will be set up. PPC will look at purchasing two muck buckets at Walmart with these to be kept in the MPC jump trailer.

Clean up – we will need help picking up the MPC jumps and packing the MPC jump trailer. Please allow for this in your move out plans.

Camp is being downsized by approximately 30%. Only 2 horse barns are being fully utilized for stalls. The half of Heritage Building that we normally have can be used for stable management, group meetings, or just a place to sit and chat or for storage. We are not being charged per se for this building with only 4 or 5 stalls being used. We are not renting the Zipperlock barn as the panels out of this barn are needed to enclose the dressage ring and opening up this building would mean an increase in the rent as 4 barns are then being used.

This puts a limit on campers and horses with a maximum of 50 horses. No extra horses will be allowed. We are operating on a very tight budget. Instructors will be housed in campers and a per diem provided for meals appropriate to the cost of eating out in Portage la Prairie.

Camp focus is on the D level of riders (D, D1 and D2), green horses, flat work, show jumping to 2/6" and stable management up to the D2 level. If more experienced members do register for camp, they may mentor the younger members, as appropriate.

Registration forms will be ready to hand out at Regional Quiz on 16 March 2008 and we ask that they be handed in at the next MPC regional meeting which is being held on Sunday, 19 April 2008. At that point, the number of registrations

will be assessed and you will be advised if there are stalls still available.

Grants – Dressage and Show Jumping Chairs will be approached.

**Testing Update**

This year we are planning to offer a Regional C1 Test. This will be optional. Branches may still run their own C1 Test if they choose.

Those planning to test C1, C2, B or B2 at the Regional Test must have their applications into Dianna Fraser Box 758, Souris, MB R0K 2C0 by February 15, 2008. Ask your DC or contact Val Crowe for a copy of the application.

The fee is \$100 per test but you can get a \$50 refund if you show up for the test, fail the written or withdraw in writing prior to the written test date.

The dates for the Regional Testing are August 25-28 at Will Farm in Carroll. There is plenty of stabling and hook ups for camping.

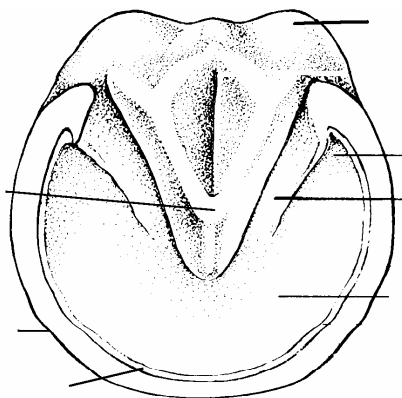

Once again this year the Canadian Pony Club is asking for your photographs for the annual calendar. The selection process has already begun for 2009 but we can start now for the 2010 effort. Here are a few tips to help improve your images.

Why is it that my pictures don't look like the ones in the magazines?

The main reason your images may differ from those found in magazines is equipment. Point and shoot cameras are great; they are portable and easy to use but they have their limitations. Long telephoto and wide angle lenses provide for different perspectives which add interest to photos. Less expensive cameras do not have either of these options but that does not mean that they are incapable of producing nice images. Read your user's manual and work with the limitations. There is a time delay when you push the shutter on many of these cameras. (This delay is to allow the camera to set exposure and focus) It becomes necessary to anticipate what your subject is doing in order to catch the right time. Your camera may not be able to take good shots of horses jumping which is great because too many of these types of photos are being submitted. Your camera is better suited to photographing your friends enjoying pony club activities.

What is the best time to take pictures?

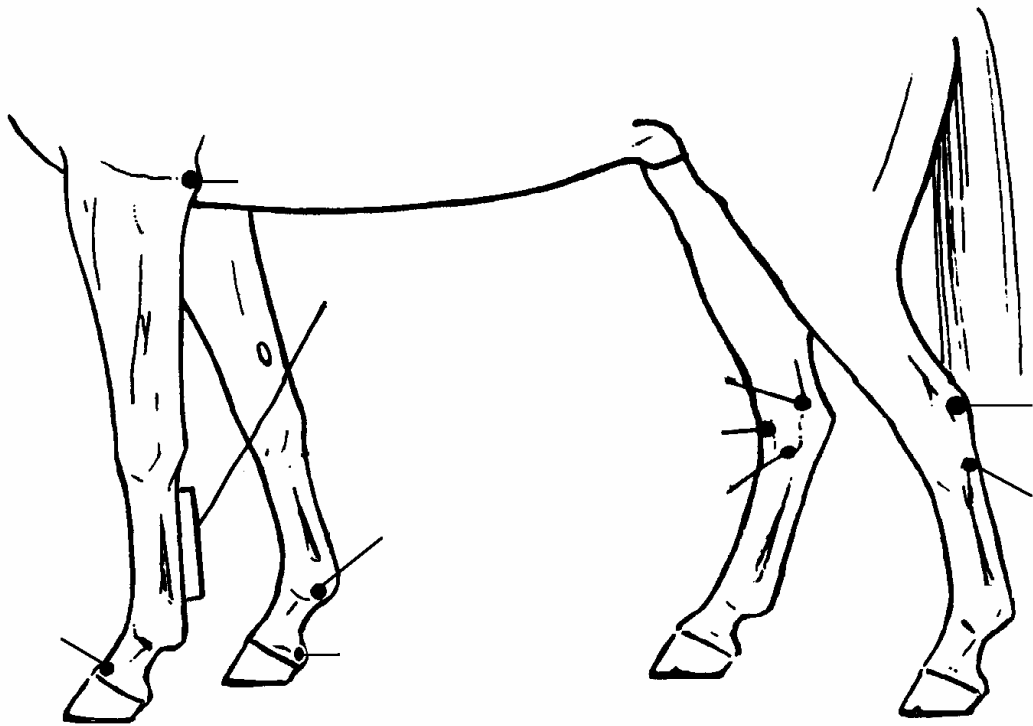
Once you have mastered the use of your equipment it is time to take some pictures. The oldest rule in photography is to shoot with the sun over your left shoulder. The light will be in front of your subject making for a better photo. Save noon for lunch. Put your camera away at this time as the sun will be too high and harsh. Early morning and evening light are much nicer. If activities are happening during lunch time go ahead and take some shots but be aware that they may not look that great.

Is it possible to take too many pictures?

The only thing cheaper than film is a photographer that won't use it. With digital technology taking pictures no longer cost money so don't be afraid to push the button. Twenty pictures from the same angle will give you twenty copies of the same subject. It is better to shoot from different angles. Try your photo from a low angle then stand and take another. Move left then right. When you get home view your images and be critical. Ask yourself what made the best photo. Get rid of the pictures that didn't work that well. In time your pictures will improve.

It's winter. Get your camera out now and start shooting. Photography is not only a summertime activity. Look for your next newsletter for more photo tips.
