News from National

There is a lot of activity and enthusiasm behind the scenes at the National level working on many different topics and I'll try to give you a brief update here.

ACE Program - The ACE Program (Across Canada Exchange) arranged at the Branch level and can include members from more than one branch is a go. This program has been revived following the suggestion by Diana Locke and a lot of work by a National Committee chaired by Judy Allen. So as you see, Nova Scotia took a lead role on this. You can see details on exactly how this ACE Program will be run on the CPC website. Just do a search for Canadian Pony Club if you've never been there before.

Stable Management Stream - This is another changing face of CPC and was approved at the National Level as a pilot project across the country for 2008 with a review in the fall. So please do forward your comments to your DC who will take those to a Regional Meeting. This is a Stable Management Program that will run from the D level up and simply means that a member can test Stable Management only through all the levels. A member must have passed their Stable Management at the previous level in order to test at any particular level; ie no riding test. Members would then be awarded their 'D1 SM' for example (no colored disc behind the CPC pin). This would allow CPC members who didn't have access to a horse or pony, an opportunity to learn and 'test' through the Stable Management Stream. Our National Youth Reps (one being our very own Laura Jacquard) are working on two new badges ... The Green Horse and Lungeing so watch the web site for those. Take lots of pictures this summer for the calendar for 2010 and pass these on to your DC by early fall. The pictures submitted for the 2009 calendar were passed on to National and have been chosen although they are keeping us in suspense until the calendars are released. So, take lots of pictures for the 2010 calendar. NSPC is looking for a \$250 sponsor to cover the cost of our calendar page. Our sponsor will be able to put an advertisement on our page in this National publication!

IPE (Inter Pacific Exchange) in 2009 will be held in Hong Kong on the Equine Olympic Site.... I understand a video of applicants riding skills will be required along with the application form to qualify for a spot on the team, so watch for a good opportunity to prepare this. It sounds very exciting and a wonderful opportunity for CPC members, so watch the website for more information and deadlines.

Celebrations for the 2009 75th Anniversary are rapidly advancing. At the National level, there will be two major festivities, one in Calgary during the summer...July 6th at the Calgary Polo Club and one in November in Toronto. As shown on the website, the Anniversary Logo has been adopted; a badge will be given to each member and there will be a number of items for sale.' If you are interested in purchasing any of these, do talk to your DC (lapel pin, carry-all bag, tie/scarf, horse brass and the history book. Passports will be revised with the new ones showing the 75th logo. Regional Show Jumping

Application deadline for Regional and National competitions is May 20th.

In the past a formula was used to determine who would represent the region for the national show jumping competition. Erin Sloan represented Nova Scotia in 2007. I believe the formula, which considers things like age, pony club level, experience riding other horses, and the applicant's regional show jumping placing, jumping height, is still a good method of choosing a representative.

This year we chose four from the eight applicants, with two alternate riders if someone from the top four were not able to compete. The four successful members are:

Krista Brouwer, OPC, Tracy Brouwer, OPC, Emma Eisses, OPC and Connie McLellan, OPC. Sarah Locke and Kari Brown were named as the alternate riders if another member was unable to compete.

This is an exciting event and we hope to see lots of our members out to cheer the team on and get a taste of the National event right here in our own Province!

Remember WVPC will be hosting a Show Jumping competition for members who wish to compete under 3' on August 3rd at Killeavy Stables in Wilmot. The forms will be sent out regionally to all DC's and the deadline for these forms will be July 15th, 2008. PEI and NB clubs were invited to attend this event making it a Zone Show Jumping competition.

On a final note we are in need of members to loan horses for the National Show Jumping competition in July. She can be contacted through her email dianajoneslocke@hotmail.com. As well she has indicated she will be in need of support from each of the branches for the July 1 – 4 National competition.

Dressage

The final details are being worked out for the Regional Championships on August 16, 2008.

A dressage clinic is planned for August 17 at CNHP with Jane Fraser as clinician.

The Regional Dressage qualifiers are six or so weeks away, we are hoping for an excellent turnout from the Region. Remember the deadline May 24, 2008 for both qualifiers.

At the National level, the new EC competition system is causing some problems within Pony Club in all Regions.

At the AGM, a motion was passed on how pony club will organize their competitions with regards to the new EC structure. The following motion was passed concerning dressage;

"That for all Canadian Pony Club Dressage Competitions for 2008, CPC and CADORA Tests will be used and the show shall obtain a PSO permit (i.e. Discovery Level)."

This decision applies to 2008 only, it is hoped that by 2009 that we can run our shows independently with our own tests and officials.

For 2008 National Dressage Championships will be run for Pre-Training, Training, 1st and 2nd Levels. There was much debate over Starter and the younger age of the members participating in that division so for this year we will not be offering Starter at the National level.
