Hoofprints Across Canada is one of the many ways that the Canadian Pony Club will celebrate its 75th Anniversary. The major celebration in Eastern Canada will be a combined Youth and Associate Member Conference, timed to coincide with the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in 2009.

As one of the host regions for this major celebration, WOR would like to sponsor as many Youth and Associate Members as possible from each of our branches. Hoofprints Across Canada is an activity that can involve every member and every parent from every WOR branch and could provide a way to sponsor branch members to this special 75th Conference and Gala Awards Celebration.

Collectively, the Trans Canada Trail, the Ontario Trailways System and Municipal Trails puts an equine friendly trail close to virtually every branch in WOR. If each branch in Canada logs 100 km of trail over the next two riding seasons, it would collectively represent a ride across Canada, hence the name Hoofprints Across Canada. Here are some points to consider:
