Some of you were young Pony Clubbers vourselves involved in all the same fun activities that your children are now. Whoever you are or wherever you were, not many will remember the last time that Pony Club celebrated a milestone anniversary. For those of you who have memories of the 50th Anniversary of Canadian Pony Club back in 1984, The Pony Express would like to record your memories of that celebration. It is a rare opportunity to be a Pony Clubber at a time that a major anniversary such as the 75th is being celebrated. Many Pony Clubbers never get this opportunity. My own children, for instance were each members for 10 –12 years, but their time as Pony Clubbers were in those interim years between anniversaries. We are fortunate to be involved with Pony Club at this

special time and everyone should make an effort to participate in some anniversary activity.

We introduced the *Hoofprints Across* Canada at the May regional meeting and in the May edition of Pony Express. This was the original name that applied to the concept where members and parents could ride together on a trail ride and log their miles along with all the other branches to collectively represent a cross-Canada ride. The name has been changed to Ride For 75, but the concept in Western Ontario Region remains the same. Headwaters Pony Club has already done an adaptation they called a 'riddle ride' and parents and members alike had great time. London Pony Club and others have upcoming rides scheduled. Every member and every parent can get involved in a ride with your branch. Let's all do one ride this year and one ride next year and log our miles on the National CPC website along with other branches and regions in Canada. You can even earn a 'Ride for 75 badge.

Next November, major anniversary celebrations will be held in Toronto coinciding with the Royal Winter Fair. This National Conference and Anniversary Gala will be held at the Holiday Inn, Yorkdale. This conference centre is centrally located right on Highway 401, just east of Highway 400. This location is easy to access for anyone coming from Western Ontario Region, Central Ontario Region or the St. Lawrence Ottawa Valley Region. It is also close to the airport for all those arriving from other regions of Canada. The Holiday Inn Yorkdale is the #1 Holiday Inn in North America

for service excellence. Rooms surround a Mediterranean style central atrium where the swimming pool, fitness center and dining facilities are located. It is very inviting facility for Pony Club families. Plan to come as a family, or better yet get a few families together from each branch and participate in all the weekend activities and Royal Winter Fair events. There will be a Disciplines Conference and a Testing and Education Conference for adults as well as a National Youth Conference program for active members. A/B/C Rally 101

So A/B/C Rally starts in two days—are you ready? Whether you're riding or grooming, there's lots of important things you need to remember. Don't do what I did one year and leave your suitcase at home (let's save that story for another editorial column). Now that I've stated the obvious, here's what you'll need to have an awesome time at A/B/C rally.

RAIN CLOTHES! I can't stress it enough! It's guaranteed to rain because I'm going. So make sure you bring lots of rain clothes. Which brings me to the next thing....

SOCKS! They get wet so fast so make sure you bring tons. Hey, at least they don't take up a lot of space in your suitcase...

YOUR MEDICAL ARMBAND. You're Pony Clubbers and are likely to have it permanently attached to yourself anyways. But a reminder never hurt anyone. Safety first and an exciting discussion about your blood type is an excellent way to break the ice if you're on a scrambled team.

Your riding clothes and FORMAL SHOW ATTIRE. The grooms round is a formal showjumping sort of thing, so make sure you have your jodphurs, jacket and show shirt.

PADDOCK BOOTS. You will get hit with penalties in stable management if you're caught in the barn with inappropriate footwear. (Don't say you weren't warned!) Make sure you bring suitable barn shoes.

JUNK FOOD! In my view this is one of the most important things after my suitcase. The food

at A/B/C Rally is fantastic (an early round of applause for the moms being back in the kitchen!), but it only comes three times a day and they don't do room service at midnight.....AND the closest Tim Horton's is about half an hour away. So bring your favourite treats!

Since School is Out, Why Not Learn a Thing or Two about WOR?

Western Ontario Region. commonly known as WOR, traces its origins back to the earlier days of Canadian Pony Club. WOR stretches east from Hwy. 27 to the shores of Lake Huron, and north from Lake Erie to Georgian Bay.

In the 1960's, Welland (1947),

London (1948) and St. Thomas (1949) formed about 30 per cent of the existing branches in the whole country and were located in the area which was to become-Western Ontario Region. Of these, London has been in existence continuously since its inception, celebrating its 60th anniversary one year before CPC's 75th.

As with all regions, WOR has seen many branches come and go, some lasting only a few years, some starting and then joining with others or changing names, and many lasting for 20 years or more.

At the height of its popularity between 1984 and 1994. WOR had 17 to 18 branches with an average annual membership of about 500. Changing demographics, increasing costs of equestrian pursuits and a more hectic, demanding lifestyle have resulted in a

However, WOR continues with 14 branches.

The creation of new branches in Western Ontario speaks well of the fine reputation Pony Club has as an equestrian youth organization.



Soon after the creation of regions within Canada, WOR established an annual trophy to be awarded to the branch accumulating the highest number of points each year through a combination of participation rates and achievement in all the regional discipline competitions.

In order to be fair to smaller branches, a somewhat complex system of scoring was developed and over the years branches large and small have vied for the ribbons to 5th place and the privilege of having their

considerably lower membership. name inscribed on the High Point Trophy. All six disciplines are represented by figurines surrounding the central column surmounted by a horseshoe.

> Although relatively small compared to many regions in Canada, WOR members have a strong reputation for active

involvement in all disciplines. In the past 37 years, we have offered yearly regional championships in all disciplines: in 1979 Show Jumping, Dressage and Tetrathlon were added to Quiz, A/B/C Rally, D Rally and PPG. With an overall average branch attendance rate of 75 per cent, the enthusiasm of our members and dedication

of our parents, volunteers and associate members is never auestioned.

We are grateful to our willing volunteers who have made it possible for WOR to also successfully host a number of national and international competitions such as PPG. Tetrathlon, Quiz, IPE, and IMGE.

WOR has benefited from the availability of wonderful resources which have enabled us to offer high quality educational, training and competitive opportunities for our members. Past members have gone on to compete at national and global levels and then made their expertise and facilities available to our aspiring equestrians. These include Mike St. Denis at Century Court, Jay and Phillipa (Bates) Hambly at Glen Arden Farms, the Pococks/Roths at Belvoir, and Kim Crawford at Highland Green.

Checkmate and Caledon Hunt Club have hosted our A/B/C Rally and D Rally respectively for years, familiar grounds to

pony clubbers both past and present. The Zanders' Cedar Peaks Farm has been the site of International Tetrathlon and A level testing, and Liz Lewis' Irish Creek Stable has welcomed many testing candidates.

WOR is also fortunate to have the University of Guelph located within its boundaries and in particular the Ontario **Veterinary College whose** generosity has supported our monthly regional meetings for many years. Our education programmes have been greatly enhanced by the ready access we have to such high levels of equine expertise.

WOR is proud of its history and determined to be an active and positive contributor to the maintenance and development of Canadian Pony Club in the years to come. We are working hard to adapt our ways of work and programmes to the demands of the 21st century but we are also committed to the principles which have sustained our organization since its inception.

A few years ago the regional committee met for a special planning meeting to review our ways of work and establish some goals for the coming

vears. In addition to reaffirming the aims and objectives of the Canadian Pony Club, we endorsed an Interpacific Exchange as well as approach to our activities which we hope will inform all the equestrian pursuits of our young members - "Be Safe, Learn Something, Have Fun". Added to "Loyalty, Character, Sportsmanship," WOR hopes this will provide a foundation for this organization to celebrate its 75 years of history and look forward to a bright future.

The London Pony Club is alive and thriving 60 years after it was established by Mrs. Dini Greenway with 17 members. Our numbers are not as large as in the past (56 in 1998) but we are very active in all Regional activities. We won the Regional High Point award in 1982 and 4 times after. Placing in the top five 18 out of past 22 years for High Point Branch of Western Ontario. We are proud of our Educational program and have fully implemented the Badge program in our education meetings and clinics for the members.

Our London members are represented at many Canadian Pony Club National competitions throughout the years. With Fiona Shearer attending the First National Quiz, many members have placed on to a Western Ontario Teams and have gone to many Nationals. Such as Lindsay Thompson, Pam Elgie, Stefanie Caddey, Carla Bauer, Darby Kletka, Allison Poel, Jessica Smith, Jean Eagleson and Abby Miller who attended as a C, then an A/B and then attended at the first Affiliate competition in 2005.

We have a very dynamic Tetrathlon group despite our small Branch numbers some years. Each year we send at least 2 to 4 competitors to Nationals. In 1986 Kim Crawford won Gold at an International Tetrathlon competition. Brendan Bailey and Jake Campbell were on the Canadian Men's International Team in 2000. Jean Eagleson at the US/Canadian competition in 2006 was 6th overall in the International Women's in Canada. As well in PPG, Erin Hendriksen was a member of the Canadian Team and competed in England in 2006.

Our Club has had members go on Invitational Events as well. In 1998, Lindsay Thompson went to South Africa for a Showjumping Exchange. In 2003, Abby Miller went to Ireland on a Fox Hunting Exchange.

London Branch has had members from Woodstock to Forest. We presently have 13 members in Ingersoll, St. Thomas, London, Parkhill and Forest area. Their levels range from 1-HB2 Affiliate, 1-C2, 2-C, 2-D2, 3-D1 and 4-E's.
