

This year why not try LeTrec?

WOR held its first annual LeTrec regional clinic on Sunday, October 17, 2010 at Shiloh place Farm just south of Belwood.

If you weren't able to attend this first-ever clinic, you're probably wondering what the heck is Le-Trec? LeTrec is short for "Technique De Randonnee Equestre De Competition" and is best described as orienteering on horseback. Trec is one of the fastest growing equine sports in the world and involves knowledge of terrain and a good understanding of map reading. Trec is designed to test a horse/rider combination through three phases which can take place on a single day, or be held over two days.





Forty-two riders from seven clubs within WOR attended the clinic with clinicians Lindsay Grice, Andrea Johnson and Joanne Handley. Participants navigated obstacle courses, learned orienteering, map and compass reading skills and trail safety.

After the clinic portion of the day, all entrants were given a map, a compass and a time limit to practice the skills that they had learned. Special thanks to the nine parent volunteers from Millridge who made this event possible!
