### ♦ Sellers:

- ♦ You must label every item with <u>your name</u>, <u>your club</u>, <u>and your price</u> before you come.
- ◆ The label must be affixed to the item by string or some other removable tag. The tags are how we pay out at the end. Stickers and tape that that we must take off the item get torn or stuck to other tags in the cash box and are hard to deal with. Tags that are put on coat hangers get separated from the item. We want our sellers to have a successful sale so be sure your tag will stay with the item but that we can easily remove it to pay you.
- Have it there early, the serious buying is done in the first half-hour every year.

- Items must be clean, no dirt and straw for us to clean up after please
- Sizes are very important if you want to sell an item.
- No helmets can legally be sold second hand so we will not carry them in the used section.
- You may be paid by cash at the end of the day (until we run out), or you may get a WOR check mailed later by our treasurer.

filly - What your mare always gives you when you want a colt.

<u>flea-bitten</u> - a condition of the lower extremities in horse owners who also own dogs and cats.

<u>flies</u> - The excuse of choice a horse uses so he can kick you, buck you off or knock you over without being punished.
