The switch to online events during the pandemic gave us a taste events we could develop in a virtual format and while it is always more fun to attend an (inter)national competition in person, in 2022 we did continue with an international virtual dressage competition and an international virtual quiz competition for Pony clubbers around the world. Luckily our National competitions did return to an in-person format and in 2022 our Regions successfully hosted National Quiz, National Show Jumping, National Dressage and National Rally.

Pony Club has so much to offer to our equestrian youth, from a place for horse crazy kids to get together share their enthousiasm about all things horsey to an organization that offers a gateway to an internationally recognized certification system and both informal or more competitive competition opportunities. This all based on a solid foundation of horse care and management.

The organization has taken strides in modernizing its technology to a more convenient way to manage the different layers within our organization. The first step in this journey is the introduction of accounting software and support available to all Branches and Regions. This will provide us with more unform and robust financial reporting throughout the organization, which will potentially open up more avenues to secure funding from donors and grants.

The Management committee is committed to continuing this journey towards modernization by introducing a membership portal that will support online sign up of members and by further restructuring the organization to better adapt to the current demands of our society in terms of safe sport, insurance, governance and conflict resolution.

We would like to thank our many volunteers that help us throughout this journey, be it in modest or substantial roles: from timers and gatekeepers to Regional chairs and working committee members, we rely heavily on all of you to keep this wonderful organization going! Thank you so much, your many efforts do not go unnoticed!

### **3 NATIONAL NEWS**



### 3.1 Financial System

In 2022 we made great strides in automatizing the financial reporting within all layers of our organization. In a collaboration with R2 accounting all Regions and Branches have been introduced to a new finance system for the Canadian Pony Club that allows for better and uniform financial reporting throughout the organization. It also provides a method of secure storage of digital financial documents.

The introduction of the system will also ensure seamless transition from one treasurer to the next in our Branches when the treasurer position may change hands. In 2022 the transition to this finance system has begun and will be further introduced to all layers of the organization in the year to come.



### 3.2 National Membership System

Improvements have been made to the National Membership System and to members' access to educational and other proprietary information on the website.

Individual members are invited to create a login to our portal, so they can review their personal information (name, address, etc.) and have access to secure documents. This eliminates the need for a general login to access secure documentation. Board members have also received a personal login code, which gives them access to relevant management documentation.



The DCs, Riding Centre Administrators and Regional Membership chairs can view their members' information through their individual access codes. Updates in the system of member information still need to be provided by the Regional Membership chairs.

### 3.3 National store

In 2022 the volume of sales was up compared to the previous year. On average the store handles 100 orders annually, with a sales volume in 2022 of \$13,000.

The badges cover the theme of 'general horse knowledge' and the consist of evolution of the horse, horse behaviour, horse senses, horse colours, gaits and footfalls and working horses.

### 3.4 National Board Meetings

We were lucky to be able to meet in person again and in November the Canadian Pony Club hosted it first Board meeting in person since 2019. The board convened in Toronto and hosted a couple of working session to discuss future plans for the CPC. This included the further roll out of the financial system, the next step in the restructuring process and topics to be further developed within the working committees.

The board also elected the new and returning officers and members of the working committees for 2023.



### 4 CANADIAN PONY CLUB MEMBERSHIP

After two years of declining membership numbers at an increased rate due to the pandemic, 2022 saw a slight increase in membership numbers again.

At the end of 2022 the Canadian Pony Club had 1762 members, divided over 1568 active (youth) members and 194 horse master members.

We were able to award 22 members with a 10-year membership certificate and pin and 5 members with a 15-year membership certificate and pin. It is



always great to see this dedication to our organization.


In 2022 four (4) members 'graduated' and aged out of the active membership category. We encourage these members to return in the coming years to join as horsemasters and give back to our organization as volunteers.

Membership numbers are increasing but are not yet back to the numbers we had in 2019. MB, ANR and BCIS are positive exceptions. MB has increased their memberships significantly compared to 2019 (+30%), and membership numbers in both ANR and BCIS are back to 2019 (or pre-pandemic) levels. Across the board it seems that participation numbers in youth sports have not yet bounced back to pre-pandemic numbers and memberships for Canadian Pony Club follow this National trend.

### 4.1 Regions

The Regions of ABS, BCLM, WOR and ABN are our largest Regions in terms of membership numbers (over 200 members each). Together they account for 50% of the Canadian Pony Club's total membership in 2022.

Alberta North has the highest number of Horse Master members. They account for 20% of the total membership within their

own Region and 23% of the total horse master population Nationally. BCIS is our only Region without any Horse Masters in 2022.

### 4.2 Branches

Our Branches form the grassroots within our organization. Branches are operated by individual volunteer boards and they organize a variety educational events, competition and testing for the Pony Club members that have joined these individual Branches.

In 2022 the Canadian Pony Club boasted 104 active branches.

Some of these Branches have been around for a significant number of years:



We welcomed 3 new branches in 2022:

- Sumas Ridge in BC Lower Mainland
- Priddis Creek in Alberta South and
- Western Horizon in Alberta North.

### 4.3 Centres



In 2010 the Canadian Pony Club adopted its Riding Centre Program for those facility owners that would like to run the CPC program at their facilities. In 2011 pilot status was granted to 3 Regions (BC Island, Alberta North and Alberta South) to include centres in their organizations.

In 2022 we have 8 Riding Centres with Pony Club members. Most are located in the Eastern part of Canada. Around 8% of the total members are members at a Riding Centre.

We welcomed 4 new riding centres in 2022:

- Manitoba Hanoverian Stable (Centre) in Manitoba,
- Hammondvale Centre in NBPEI,
- Valley Equestrian Centre in Saskatchewan and
- Silver Fox Centre in Western Ontario.

We appreciate the support from these faciality owners and are happy they value the Canadian Pony Club as a program that will support the development of their clients in the equine field.

### 5 TESTING

Canadian Pony Club hosted a National A test again in 2022.

#### We congratulate Clare Carmicheal from the BCLM Region on achieving her Full A in 2022!

The testing documentation for all levels has been updated and is available on the CPC website.

All forms and record sheets are now available in a separate document. The term 'lead examiner' has been introduced, including a description of their duties during a test. Additional requirements have been introduced for examiners to be qualified to perform testing for the Canadian Pony Club. This includes safe sport training, a first aid certificate and a criminal record check to align with current practices in Canadian sports.

### 6.1 National Rally 2022

The Canadian Pony Club National Rally competition was hosted by the Alberta South Region, August 22 to 26, 2022 at Prentice Creek Equestrian Centre in Clearwater County.



The competition was hosted in a mixed division consisting of Entry and Pre-training competitors.

There were 12 riders competing in 6 teams. Each team consisted of 2 riders, a groom and a captain. The riders, grooms and captains are each judged throughout the competition. Riders compete in a dressage test, a show jumping round and an XC round. The team is judged on the turnout of the riders and horses, trot up and cooldown and the general efficiency and neatness of stall and tack areas during

### 7 INTERNATIONAL ALLIANCE (PCIA)



Canadian Pony Club is one of the national Pony Clubs worldwide that is part of the Pony Club International Alliance. Other members include the UK, the US, Australia, New Zealand, Hongkong, South Africa and Ireland.

Unfortunately, due to the worldwide pandemic all international exchanges had to be put on hold and will not start back up again till 2023. However, competition in Quiz, Dressage and Show Jumping have been moved to a virtual format, offering competitors in the PCIA countries an opportunity to compete on an international stage, albeit virtually.

Canada participated in the disciplines of Quiz and Dressage. The timing of the Show Jumping competition (October/November) made it hard for Canada to send in a team in 2022.

#### PCIA virtual dressage

The second International virtual dressage show was hosted in October 2022. The international dressage competition is truly a world-wide collaboration as Canadian Pony Club supplied the judging for the training level entries and made sure the prize winners in that division received their ribbon.

The virtual dressage show boasted five divisions consisting of: Training Level (14 and under), First Level (18 and under), Second Level (25 and under), Pas de Deux (all ages), and Prix Caprilli (all ages). 2022's PCIA Virtual Dressage Show saw 160 entries (up from 144 competitors last year) competing from Australia, Canada, Hong Kong (China), Ireland, New Zealand, South Africa, the United Kingdom, the United States, Singapore, and the Cayman Islands.
